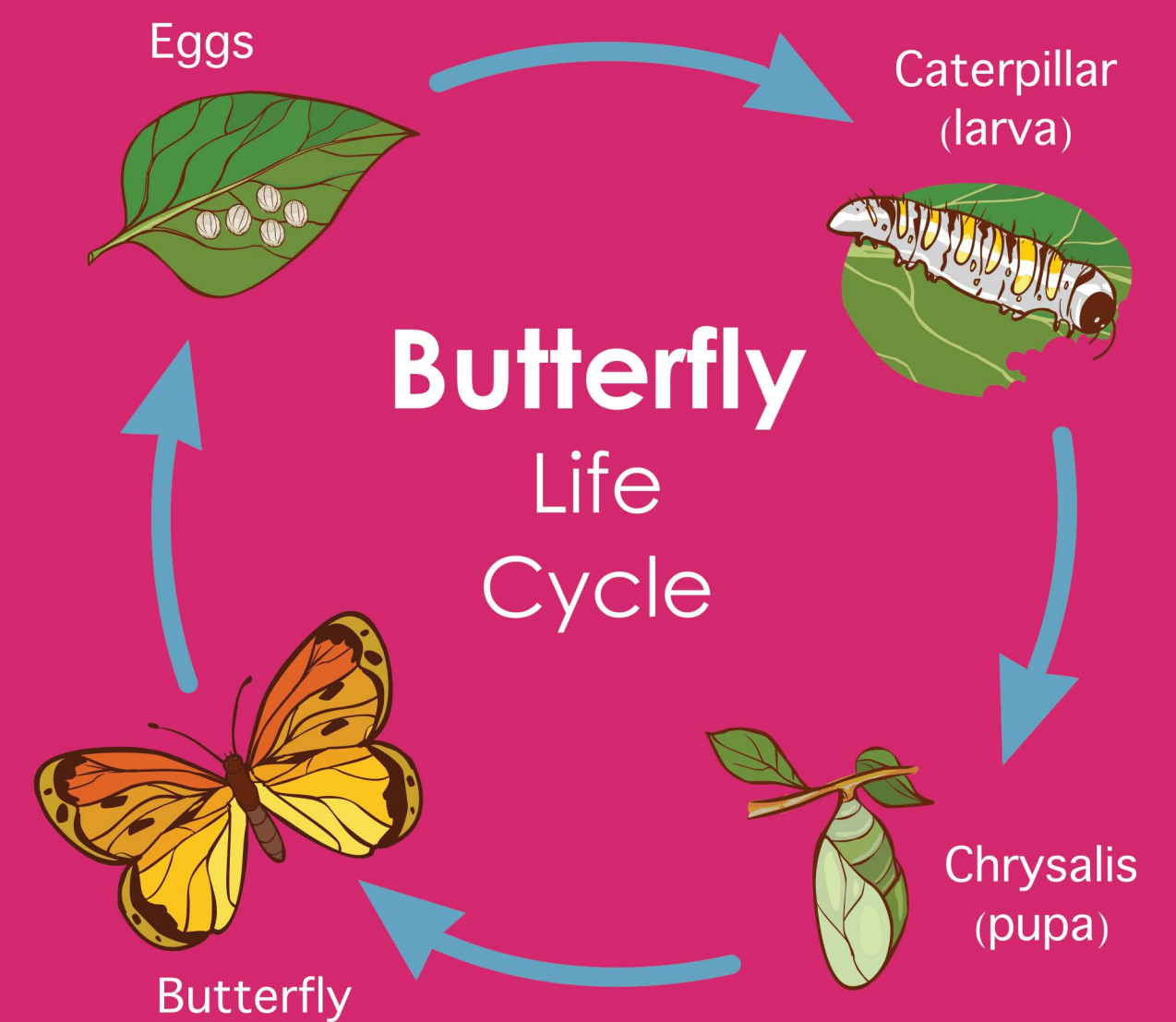


BUTTERFLIES

Butterflies go through four distinct stages in their life cycle: **egg**, **larva (caterpillar)**, **pupa (chrysalis)**, and **adult (butterfly)**. As soon as a caterpillar hatches, it must begin eating the right type of plant, or its host plant. Caterpillars will feed on the leaves and adult butterflies will feed on the nectar in the flowers. Adult butterflies will also lay eggs on the leaves, and the life cycle will start over. These plants were selected to host and attract many different kinds of butterflies, like Monarchs and Swallowtails.
