How to Use It (<http://makeymakey.com/how-to/classic/>)

1. Plug board into your computer

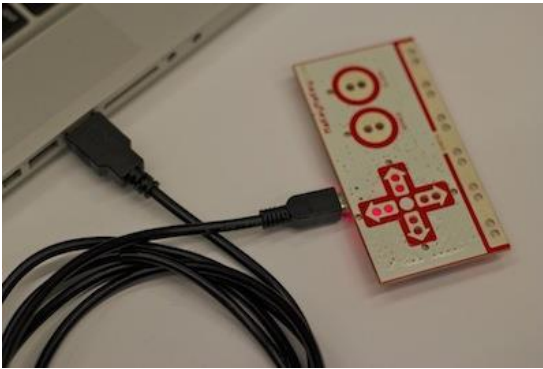
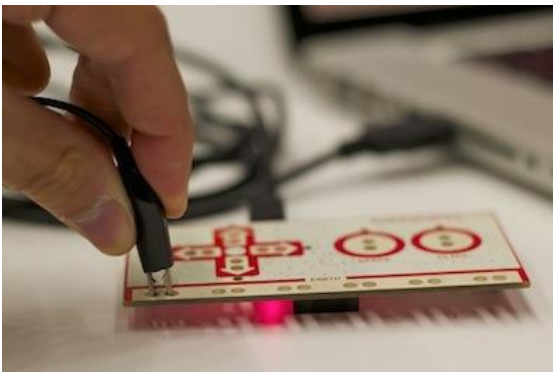
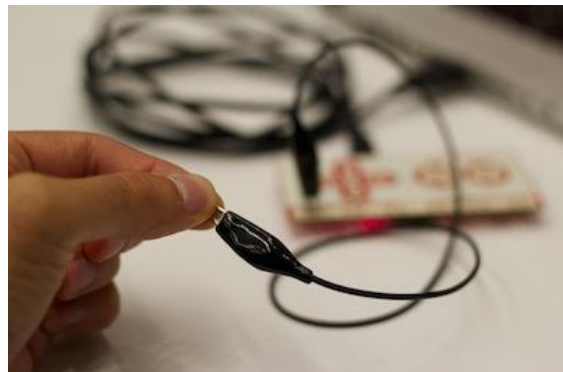

2. Close any pop-up windows
3. Connect yourself to EARTH

4. Try the Board. Open any text editor (Word, etc.). While you're still grounded, touch the round "Space" pad on the Makey Makey. You should see a green light on the Makey Makey, and your computer will think the space bar was pressed.

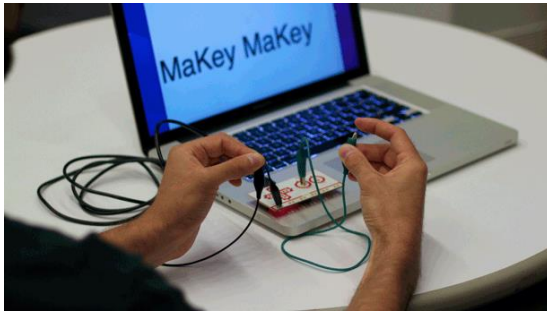

5. Connect everyday objects to board with alligator cables. Almost any conductive object will work. Try metal objects, food such as fruit, etc.
