One Year Later...

//IT'S HARD TO BELIEVE IT'S BEEN A YEAR SINCE THE PANDEMIC BEGAN IMPACTING MANY FACETS OF DAILY LIFE, INCLUDING DAILY OPERATIONS AT WASHINGTON-CENTERVILLE PUBLIC LIBRARY. After closing both libraries on March 13 (yes, that was Friday the 13th), Library Director Liz Fultz challenged library staff to offer citizens as much library service as we could, as quickly as possible.

After closure, we immediately began to promote digital collections and services and in less than two weeks, we offered our first virtual book discussions and storytimes. By mid-May we were offering a brand new curbside hold pickup service and in June 2020 we welcomed visitors back into Woodbourne Library for limited hours and services. We were able to reopen both libraries for inperson service, and complete a major parking lot repair at Centerville Library, in five months. Even as late as January, only 50% of public libraries our size or larger, were open for inperson service. And of those, only a handful were offering more open hours than WCPL. In March, we will add evening hours at both libraries.

WCPL has a long history of rising to meet the changing needs of patrons. In 2020, we evolved service models in order to continue to serve patrons in the throes of a pandemic. We did so in a slow, phased approach that balanced safety and service. We appreciate the support of the community during the past 12 challenging months and we thank our staff and board of trustees for their unwavering commitment to serve our community.
