"ON NOVEMBER 2, LOCAL RESIDENTSWILL VOTE ON A 3.0 MILLS RENEWAL CONTINUOUS LEVY FOR WASHINGTONCENTERVILLE PUBLIC LIBRARY. The

levy will generate approximately \$5 million in revenue annually, at no additional cost to local taxpayers, and will support current operating expenses.

The current 3.0 mills operating levy was passed in 2011 and is set to expire at the end of this year. The local operating levy provides 66% of the Library's total revenue. "Our citizens take a lot of pride in having a 5-Star Library. The quality of the Library's collection, services, programming and facilities are, in large part, a result of the unwavering financial support of local taxpayers. We realize how fortunate we are and work hard to be good stewards of public tax dollars," says Liz Fultz,

Library Director. Centerville/Washington Township citizens vote and pay only for the Washington-Centerville Public Library levy. They do not vote or pay for other library levies in Montgomery County.

Currently, the owner of a Centerville/
Washington Township home assessed at
\$100,000 pays less than \$75 annually for
the Library's levy. Washington-Centerville
Public Library provides \$5.43 in return for
every \$1 in taxes paid. "We are proud of the
return on investment the Library provides
its citizens. You can quickly recover your
tax investment, and then some, by simply
borrowing books and movies, using a free
meeting room, or attending a free event at
the Library," says Ms. Fultz. The Library
has not asked for any additional money since
2011.






