We love teens, and we know they are hungry for inspiration. Their brains are growing at an astonishing pace, and they need to be challenged and supported. Since they seek positive social activities with others their age, we provide a nurturing space for teens to learn, create, and thrive.

Our enthusiastic teen librarians carefully curate our youth collection, including access to all sorts of non-traditional items like musical instruments, telescopes, jewelry-making kits, and even museum passes through our Library of Things. Additionally, the library's calendar is packed with great events and programs for teens: sometimes learning, sometimes creating, but always FUN. There are too many activities to list, but below is a sample of our offerings.

Totally Teen Tuesdays:

Each month (weekly in the summer), teens can look forward to an ever-changing array

of activities like trivia, karaoke, bingo, game nights, scavenger hunts and more.

Teen Advisory Board:

Our Teen Advisory Board (TAB) guides our choices in programming and gives us feedback on collection items. They also get volunteer hours, assisting with programs of all kinds. These teens are valued members of the library community.

Lock-Ins:

Three times a year, we hold a lock-in, where teens get to be in the library after hours. They play flashlight tag and other games, eat pizza, and generally get loud and crazy in the LIBRARY, of all places. Sorry, adults. It's teens ONLY.


Books Over Brunch:

What could be better than rolling out of bed on a Saturday morning to join other teens for brunch and a book discussion?

Make-It Programs:

Get hands-on with crafting sessions where teens can create everything from fake

geodes to pinhole cameras and diverse art projects.

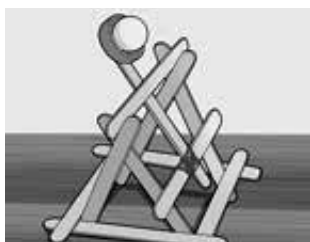
