Dottie Yeck Good Life Award Goes to Incarnation School 8th Grader

Hope Bradley, an 8th grader in Mrs. Erin Bade's class at Incarnation School is the winner of the 17th annual Dottie Yeck Good Life Award Writing Contest hosted by Washington-Centerville Public Library. From a pool of 790 entries, Hope's essay about using her personal strengths and attitude to positively influence a situation earned the highest score throughout the three rounds of judging. Miss Bradley will receive a certificate of merit as well as a check for \$3,000. The contest is fully funded by the Dorothy R. Yeck Good Life Award endowment.

Second place (\$500) went to Hailey Kutscher in Mr. Jim Gobrail's freshman class at Centerville High School, third place (\$350) to Vaidika Ravi, also in Mr. Gobrail's class, and fourth place (\$250) went to Arwen Feng, a freshman in Mrs. Megan Joseph's class at Oakwood High School. In addition, \$250 will be awarded to Mrs. Bade's class. Twenty one Honorable Mentions will also be presented with a certificate. Those include students from Centerville High School, Chaminade Julienne High School, Incarnation School, Kettering-Fairmont High School, Magsig Middle School, Northmont Middle School, Oakwood High School, and Watts Middle School.

The contest honors the legacy of Mrs. Dottie Yeck, who was a life-long supporter of libraries, children, and the arts. Her philosophy of Being Good + Doing Good = Having Fun + Being Happy has inspired more than nine thousand teens across the Miami Valley to write about laying a good foundation for their lives over the contest's 17-year history. Mrs. Yeck was a long-time trustee of the Library and the Yeck Family Foundation continues to support her legacy of community involvement.

The top four writers will read their essays at the <u>Good Life Award Celebration</u> at Centerville Library on Thursday, December 1, beginning at 7 p.m. All of the winning entries can be read on the Library's website at https://www.wclibrary.info/gla/winners/. Also speaking at the Celebration will be author and nationally known teen leadership expert Fran Kick. Kick will give a fun and dynamic presentation about personal leadership and self-motivation — relevant to people of all ages!
